#### **Meet Our Keynote Speakers**



**Dr. Shuhua An** is a Professor of mathematics education in the Department of Teacher Education in California State University, Long Beach. Dr. An serves as the Director for the Graduate Program in Mathematics Education at the College of Education. She is also an Editorial Board Member of the *Journal of Mathematics Education*, an Editorial board member for the *Journal of Quaderni di Ricerca in Didattica*, and an Associate Editor of the *Journal of the School Science and Mathematics*.



**Dr. Jinfa Cai** is a Professor of Mathematics and Education. He is interested in how students learn mathematics and solve problems, and how teachers can provide and create learning environments so that students can make sense of mathematics. He received a number of awards, including a National Academy of Education Spencer Fellowship, an American Council on Education Fellowship, an International Research Award, and a Teaching Excellence Award. He has been serving on the Editorial Boards for several international journals, such as the *Journal for Research in Mathematics Education*. He was a visiting professor in various institutions, including Harvard University. Currently, he serves as a Program Director at the Division of Research for Learning at the National Science Foundation and a co-chair of American Educational Research Association's Special Interest Group on Research in Mathematics Education (AERA's SIG-RME) (2010-2012).



**Dr. Pyzdrowski** is an Associate Professor in the Mathematics Department at West Virginia University. She is the Pre-Collegiate Mathematics Coordinator. She collaborates on projects with the West Virginia Department of Education and the West Virginia Higher Education Policy Commission and has been both PI and Co-PI on several NSF and state grants with a focus of mathematics education. Her research explores how the use of technology in the mathematics classroom impacts students' learning. She currently serves as a member of the West Virginia Common Core State Standards Working Group.




